Adults with an underlying medical condition	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Organ transplant recipients who are on immune suppressive therapy • People who have had a bone marrow transplant in the last 24 months • People on immune suppressive therapy for graft versus host disease • People who have haematological cancers diagnosed within the last 5 years (e.g. leukaemia, lymphoma or myelodysplastic syndrome) • People having chemotherapy or radiotherapy • People with chronic renal (kidney) failure • People with heart disease (e.g. coronary heart disease or failure) • People with chronic lung disease (excluding mild or moderate asthma) • People who have a non-haematological cancer diagnosed in the last 12 months • People who have diabetes • People with severe obesity (body mass index of 40 or over) • People with chronic liver disease • People with some neurological conditions including stroke and dementia • People with some chronic inflammatory conditions and treatments • People with other primary or acquired immunodeficiency including HIV • People with poorly controlled blood pressure 	GP or Respiratory Clinic.
